

MIKE OSBORNE SCHOLARSHIP 2021-2022

The Mike Osborne Memorial Scholarship Fund is sponsored by BEA for the benefit of graduating high school seniors who are children of active members of the Beaverton Education Association.

This scholarship is in honor of Mike Osborne who was serving as the School Board Chair for the Beaverton School District when he passed away in May of 2006. While serving on the Beaverton School Board, Mike served on two Bargaining Teams and worked closely with the Beaverton Education Association. Prior to being elected to the School Board in 2001, Mike served on the District's Budget Committee and was a member of the Local School Committee at Oak Hills, Findley and Stoller. He was a classroom volunteer for more than 12 years, the former Chairman of the March of Dimes, served five years on the SIDS Foundation, and was involved with the Boy Scouts. Mike used to say that he had over 35,000 children when referring to the students in the Beaverton School District. His volunteer actions supported these words.



Scholarship Funding Details

Scholarships will be awarded in amounts ranging from \$500 to \$1,000 up to a total of \$6,000 overall. Announcements of the scholarships will be made at the senior awards assembly at the end of the year at each recipient's high school. The money must be used for college or trade school related expenses including tuition, books or fees.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Applicant must be the legal child, stepchild or dependent of an Active BEA member.
2. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior but does not need to be attending a BSD school.
3. Applicant must provide proof of acceptance from an accredited four-year college, community college or accredited trade school.

Process for Application and Criteria

1. The Beaverton Education Association will announce this scholarship offering through both the BEA Focus Newsletter and the BEA website, www.beavertonea.org in February of each school year.
2. The Executive Board of the BEA will be responsible for appointing a group of members to review applications. No member who has a child applying may be part of the review committee.
3. The BEA and its Executive Board will review the scholarship process and allocated amount each year.
4. Applicants must fill out the Scholarship Application and include the following supporting data:
 - a. Copy of high school transcript through first senior semester
 - b. Copy of acceptance letter from college or trade school
 - c. Essay on personal experiences in volunteerism (750 word maximum)
 - d. Letter of recommendation from a teacher
 - e. Letter of recommendation from another adult
 - f. Due to COVID-19 protocols, application materials must be sent electronically to Beaverton Vice President Lindsay Ray at beavertonVP@oregoned.org. Applications can be found at beavertonea.org and are due to beavertonVP@oregoned.org by 4:00 pm on March 18th, 2022.
5. You will be notified by May 15th if you are to be awarded a scholarship and an announcement will be placed in the June BEA FOCUS newsletter.
